- Open Standard Arrival Routes STARs
- Point Merge
- Closed STARs

Non-RNP / Legacy Jet Fleet and Turbo-Prop aircraft to either an Instrument Landing System approach or an intermediate positioned Visual or Radar Vectored (Open STAR) approach to join final.

Concept of Operations - CONOPS

- Operations to or from the South and East will generally be assigned the Existing Main Runway – 01R / 19L
- Operations to or from the North and West will generally be assigned the New Runway – 01L / 19R
- No Jet operations to or from the South to the New Runway between 11.00pm and 6.00am (consistent with the EIS) - (limited Turbo-prop operations)
- Over Bay operations to be the preferred Mode during the Night period – weather conditions permitting

Noise Abatement

- Noise Abatement Procedures are being developed to guide operations on the Parallel Runway System in the interests of Community outcomes
- Draft Noise Abatement procedures are being discussed with the major Airlines through the Technical Noise and Environment Working Group (TNEWG)

The NAPs define:

- Preferred over-water operations at night
- Preferred Runway 19 operating direction
- Minimisation of Reverse Thrust application on the NPR
